

Helpful Tree Debris Disposal Tips

Texas Disposal Systems (TDS)

Each household located within Northtown M.U.D. may receive 2 FREE bulky garbage pick-ups per year, which may include tree debris, brush and limbs. **Please call TDS in advance at [1-800-375-8375](tel:1-800-375-8375) to schedule such a pick-up.**

The tree debris, brush and limbs must be bundled and securely tied together in an easily handled package, not exceeding 4 feet in length and 40 pounds. The bundle should be left on the curb.

Travis County Adds Additional Tree Debris Drop Off at Northeast Metropolitan Park for Travis County Residents

(Travis County, TX) - Starting Saturday, February 18, 2023, Travis County will add an additional drop-off location for tree debris at Northeast Metropolitan Park, located at 15500 Sun Light Near Way, Pflugerville, TX 78660.

The new Eastern Crescent drop-off site will be open every day from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and will only accept tree limbs, branches, shrubs, and leaves. Household trash, appliances, metal, or other non-vegetative debris will not be accepted.

Residents may experience long wait times at the drop-off site due to high demand across the County for debris drop-off after the historic ice storm.

Travis County residents can also utilize Mansfield Dam Park, located at 4370 Mansfield Dam Park Rd. Austin, TX 78732. This is open every day from 10 am to 3 pm. Also available is Austin Water's Hornsby Bend Biosolids Management Plant at 2210 FM 973 Austin, TX 78725. This site is open every day from 8 am. to 4:30 pm.

All listed sites are free for Travis County residents to use.

For residents in Travis County's unincorporated areas who are unable to bring their debris to drop-off sites, the County's Transportation and Natural Resources (TNR) Department is working on bringing on contractors to help with curbside debris pickup. The pickup schedule isn't available yet, but these unincorporated area residents are asked to go ahead and cut their debris into four-to-five-foot pieces and place them by their curb by Monday, February 20, 2023.

Other storm debris cleanup information, including information about privately-run debris drop-off locations that may charge a fee, is available on the Travis County Office of Emergency Management's winter storm recovery page.
