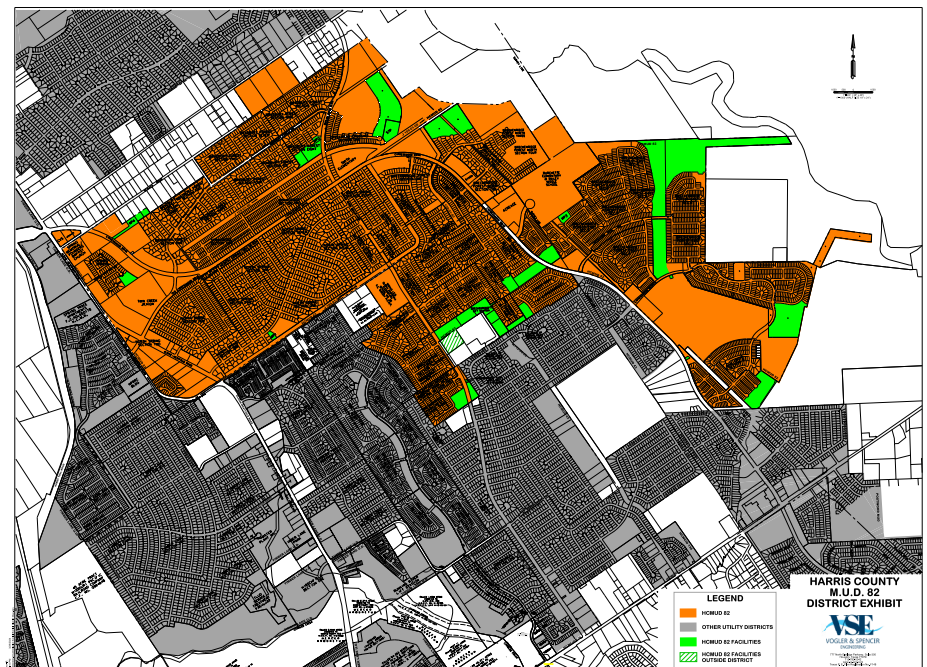

Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 82 (the "District") was created by order of the Texas Water Rights Commission, now the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, on May 30, 1973, to purchase, construct, operate and maintain all works, improvements, facilities and plants necessary for the supply and distribution of water; the collection, transportation, and treatment of wastewater; and the control and diversion of storm water.

The District provides water and sewer services via three water plants and a state of the art wastewater treatment plant to residential homes, businesses and Spring ISD schools located within the district. Other management responsibilities include garbage collection, recycling and maintaining security for the district facilities. The Board was recognized by AWBD in 2011 for its efforts in water conservation.

The District is located in northern Harris County approximately 23 miles north of the central business district of the City of Houston and contains approximately 2,219 acres of land.

WHY SHRED?

Shredding documents is an excellent way to get rid of important papers and **protect you from identity theft**. You can watch as your material is shredded on-site and enjoy peace of mind that your information has been destroyed.



ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- No Metal Binders or Binder Clips (paper clips and staples are acceptable)
- No Wet Paper
- No Hard Drives, CD's, Video Tapes, or Film Reels
- No Boxes

Please do not bring your paper in a plastic bag.

This slows the process down as the bag must be ripped open and inspected before disposing of the paper.

Please bring it loose inside a box and the box will be returned to you.

Trashcan or Recycle Container Damaged?

Front-Porch Household Hazardous Waste Collection



Residents can now sign up for convenient Curbside Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection provided through HHW Solutions, a Best Trash company.

If you have unwanted chemicals, old paint, batteries, or pool supplies cluttering up your garage or home, you no longer need to haul them away yourself—HHW Solutions will pick them up directly from your curb.

How It Works

1. **Schedule Your Pickup:** Visit www.hhwsolutions.com to view the next collection day for our community and schedule your pickup online.
2. **Prepare Your Items:** Safely package your items according to the handling guidelines (see below).
3. **Set Out for Collection:** Place your items at the curb by 7:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.



Important Safety & Handling Guidelines

Keep Original Containers: Keep products in their original containers with labels intact when possible. If the original label is missing, label the item yourself if you are certain of its contents.

Do NOT Mix Chemicals: Keep items separated; mixing chemicals together can cause dangerous reactions or fires. Do not place all chemicals together in a single trash bag.

Handle Leaks: If a chemical container is leaking, secure it inside a secondary leak-proof container or clear plastic bag.

What Can Be Collected?

Household & Personal Care: Cleaners, aerosols, adhesives, drain openers, pest control, solvents, nail polish remover, peroxides, rubbing alcohol.

Paint & Stains: Paint, stains, and solvents (Min 1 gal, Max 4 gals).

Yard, Pool & Spa Care: Fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, poisons, pool/spa chemicals, and cleaners (Min 1 gal, Max 4 gals).

Automotive: Motor oil, antifreeze, diesel, gasoline, waxes, cleaners, and polishes (Min 1 gal, Max 8 gals)

Batteries: Auto/Marine lead-acid, rechargeable (Ni-Cd, Li-Ion, Ni-MH, Lithium) (Min 1, Max 20).

Note: Single-use alkaline batteries (AA, C, D) can be thrown in your regular trash.

Mercury Lamps & Devices: CFLs, fluorescent tubes, mercury thermometers, and thermostats (Min 1, Max 8).

Tanks & Fire Safety: Propane tanks (30 lbs or less, limit 2), helium tanks (20 lbs or less), and fire extinguishers.

Other: Ammunition, fireworks, and flares.

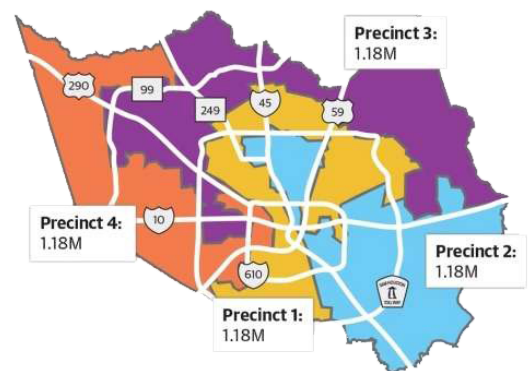
ALL ABOUT Harris County Precinct 3



Commissioner Precinct 3 is led by Tom Ramsey. Since the 2021 redistricting, Precinct 3 spans as far west as Cypress - as far north as Tomball and Huffman - and as far east as Crosby. Responsibilities for Commissioner Ramsey's office include the maintenance of nearly 6,800 miles of roadway, 72 parks, and 11 Community and Nature Centers, which encompasses Mercer Arboretum and Botanic Gardens as one of America's last free botanical gardens, and Jones H. Jones Park and Nature Center as part of a 312-acre nature preserve located along Spring Creek.

Precinct 3 is also proud to be home to, and partner with, 15 school districts, 11 cities, 202 municipal utility districts, and approximately 1,000 neighborhoods.

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF A COUNTY COMMISSIONER?

- Serves on the Commissioners Court alongside the County Judge to exercise broad county-wide policy-making authority.
- Serves as the official representative for one of four precincts within the county.
- Responsible for building and maintaining county roads, bridges, and local drainage systems within their precinct.
- Oversees local precinct parks and community centers.

What happens during Commissioners Court?

The members conduct the general business of the county, which consists of:

- Adopting the county's budget and tax rate
- Approving all budgeted county purchase
- Filling vacancies in elective & appointive offices
- Setting all salaries and benefits
- Authorize contracts
- Providing and maintaining all county buildings and facilities.

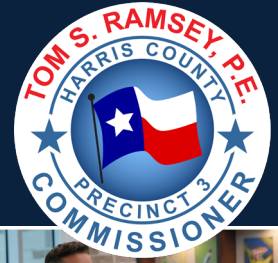

Enhanced Community Safety: HCMUD 82 Renews Interlocal Agreement with HCCO Precinct 4



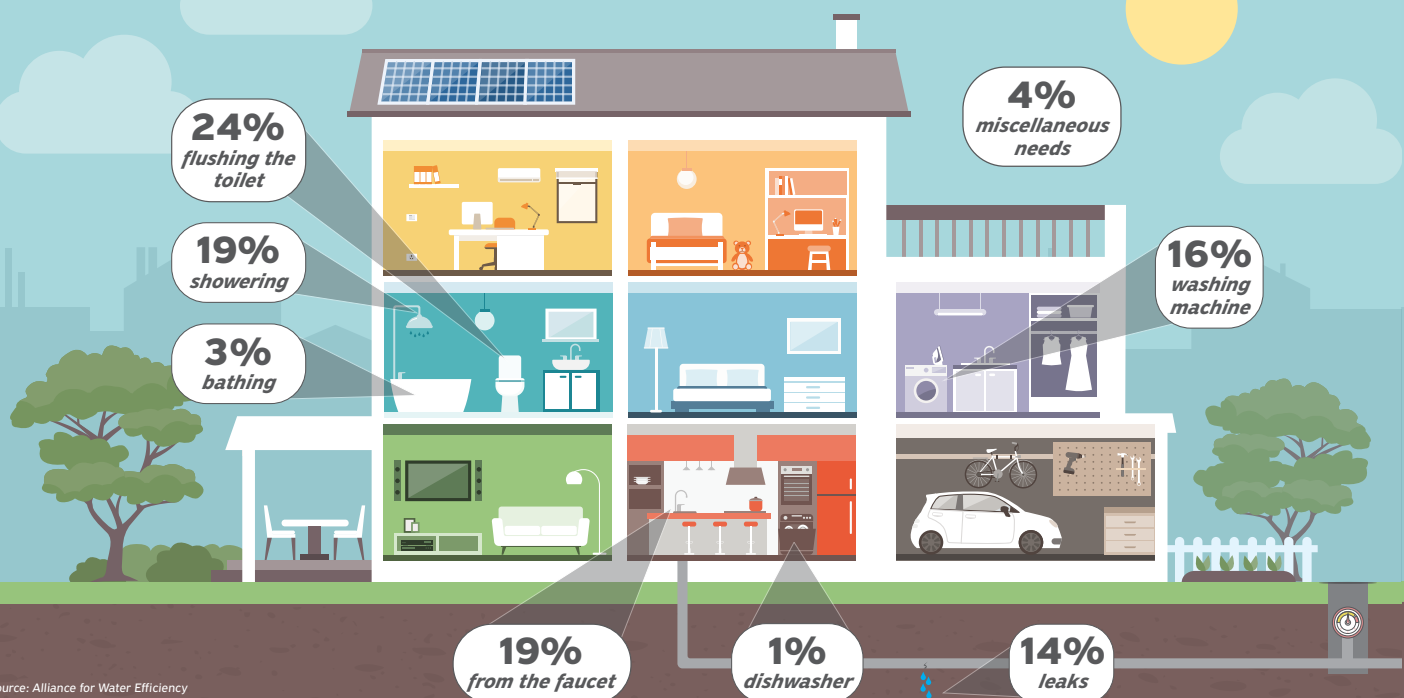
Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 82 is pleased to announce the renewal of its law enforcement services agreement with the Harris County Constable's Office, Precinct 4 (HCCO) for Fiscal Year 2027 (October 1, 2026 – September 30, 2027).

Key Highlights of the Agreement:

- **Increased Deputy Coverage:** The District has expanded its dedicated law enforcement contract from 12 to 13 deputies, providing enhanced coverage across our community.
- **Dedicated Presence:** Contracted deputies will devote 65% of their working time directly to law enforcement services and patrols within the District's service area.
- **Proactive Neighborhood Security:** The agreement utilizes strategic patrol zones and halo coverage to maximize police visibility, deter criminal activity, and improve emergency response times.

Through this interlocal agreement, Harris County MUD 82 remains committed to providing a safe, secure environment and a proactive layer of protection for all residents and businesses in the district.
